Your Night to Remember!

"Last Dinnner on the Titanic," the Library's first gala fund raising dinner in years, is Friday, Jan. 15, at the Iowa Memorial Union Main Lounge and adjoining dining spaces. It promises to be a night to remember!

Seating is limited to 200 in each of Steerage and Second Class and 100 in First Class. Details (including the complete, historically accurate menues for each dining clas) can be obtained at the ICPL Development Office, 356-5205. The evening's entertainment includes the Irish folk band, "Stones in the Field;" a 14-piece string orchestra provided by the Iowa City Community String Orchestra; pianist Mary Miller; and the Preucil School of Music's Chanterelle String Quartet.

The dinner is based on the book *Last Dinner on the Titanic*, by Rick Archbold. The Toronto-based author will attend the dinner, giving



insight into the facts and myths surrounding the ill-fated ship's sinking. But Archbold's focus will be on the food and ambiance of the Titanic's famous dining rooms and food. (He may even comment on which of the films about the ship are more historically accurate and why.) Two of ICPL's reference librarians have prepared Web site and book lists on the Titanic to help you prepare for your night of "traveling through time" to The Gilded Age and its trappings.
