Volunteering at the Library

The Library welcomes and encourages people of all ages to volunteer.

Assistance is needed to check-in and pre-sort books and other items; work at the used book store; help with adult and children's programs; assist with special events, such as Children's Day and the adult Spelling Bee; filing and typing; data entry; prepare mailings; etc. ICPL volunteers range in age from third

grade to teens to seniors.

The ICPL Development Office coordinates the Friends Foundation's ongoing efforts to raise private contributions to enhance the Library's operations and acquisitions budgets. The office also produces the Library's bi-monthly newsletter, The Window; helps coordinate the Library's promotion and public relations programs; and coordinates the recruitment and

placement of Library volunteers.

The 24-member Friends Foundation
Board of Directors oversees ICPL fund
raising, which includes the Annual Fund
(used by the Library to add books and
materials to the collection); increasing
and managing the Library's endowment;
and raising private contributions for
special Library needs and programs. The
Foundation Board is conducting a \$3.5
million campaign for the Library
expansion and increasing the endow-

ment.

The seven-member Book End Committee, a standing committee of the Foundation Board, oversees the operation of The Book End used bookstore. The Book End Committee has pledged at least \$25,000 in net proceeds to the capital campaign for the Library expansion project.
