PIANO CAMPAIGN COMPLETE

The Iowa City Public Library Foundation marked the end of a fundraising campaign with a reception and the unveiling of a specially designed plaque honoring contributors. Funds were raised to purchase and maintain the Tadashi grand piano located in

Meeting Room A at the Library. The piano was purchased from the Friends of Historic Preservation for \$9,600. Major contributors to the campaign included Herb and Janice Wilson and John Crawford.
