Book Gala '98 Offers Shopping, Launches *Titanic* Dinner Effort

The ICPL Friends Foundation's fifth annual Book Gala takes place at Prairie Lights Books on Sunday, Nov. 8—and it promises to be a night to remember, for a number of reasons.

Once again, the Library's contributors, volunteers and other special friends are invited to join the ICPL staff at Prairie Lights for an evening of special shopping. The book store will be open from 6:30 to 8 p.m. exclusively for Book Gala '98 participants. Prairie Lights owner Jim Harris will contribute 20 per cent of the evening's total sales to the Friends Foundation. Since 1994, Book Gala has generated some \$8,000 in support of the Library.

This year's Book Gala has an added feature—the official launching of another Friends Foundation special event, "The Last Dinner on the Titanic," a fund-raising dinner that will recreate the dining experiences aboard the H.M.S. Titanic. The Jan. 15 event is based on the 1997 book, Last Dinner on the Titanic: Menus and Recipes from the Great Liner, co-authored by Rick Archbold. Mr. Archbold will attend dinner, guiding participants through an evening of fine dining, musical entertainment and dancing.

Invitations to "Last Dinner at the Titanic" will be mailed the week of Nov. 8-14 to all households receiving The Window through the mail. Persons attending Book Gala 98 on Nov. 8 will receive advance information about the Titanic dinner and have a chance to win a free ticket to the Jan. 15 event.

East-Side, West-Side Sites Chosen for Library's New Remote Book/AV Drops

Two sites for ICPL's newest patron service--remote drops for book and audio-visual materials--have been selected and will be operational by mid-November, Library Director Susan Craig announced.

On the east site of Iowa City, Library patrons will be able to return books and AV items by driving through the pharmacy lane at the Hy-Vee Food Store at 812 S. First Avenue. On the city's west side, the same service will be available at the University of Iowa Community Credit Union's facility at 825 Mormon Trek Blvd.

"Our thanks go to these two local businesses for providing a place for the book drops and allowing the Library to extend its services beyond the downtown Library building," said Heidi Lauritzen, ICPL Circulation Services coordinator.
